Review and follow instructions, providing enrichment activity to cats at their cage or in their designated room. 3. Enrichment activities include but are not limited to grooming, petting, playing, sitting and talking with the cats. 4. For each cat room, you will be expected to understand and follow guidelines for the use of that specific room. 5. You will be expected to spend time with at least 5 cats per shift. 6. Record observations and health concerns (if you have them) at the end of a visit and before your move on to work with the next cat. 7. Adhere to dress code – cover legs; no open toed shoes, etc. 8. All volunteers welcome the public and serve as HSDR ambassadors in a professional manner. 9. Adhere to all biosecurity protocols for specific rooms and wear appropriate PPE for each room and animal Qualifications 1. 18 years of age or older. 2. Interest in/and love of cats. Training Prior to doing the first shift you will complete: 1. General Orientation to Humane Society of Durham Region. 2. Cat Basics Training that includes: Department protocols. Reading body language, ways to approach a cat, how cats communicate, handling techniques, grooming,

petting and playing; common feline health problems found in the shelter.
Candidates are required to complete a questionnaire and responses will be evaluated
<u>Commitment</u> Time commitment is 2 hours per week. Minimum of 6 months
commitment required, with regular attendance for this role.
